Citizens' Charter- General Achievements

- * Improved access to clean drinking water of over 2 million people in rural communities
- * Improved access of 21,749 people in rural to basic electricity by providing overall 375 KWs of electricity
- * Improved access to the nearest road and market of over 62,279 people in rural areas by constructing 244 KMs of basic road
- * Overall 3.2 million days of work in rural areas and estimated 2.6 million days of work in urban areas under normal CCAP
- * Total 8 millions labor days created under MCCG.
- * Over 10,700 rural communities established grain banks, food and non-food items with value of \$4,609,851 mobilized and \$2,180,594 SIG matching grants were disbursed, and 82,554 vulnerable households benefited
- * Over 107 sub-projects are ongoing for 101 Kuchie CDCs with value of \$1.4 million
- * Physical work of 850 schools in progress, 650 school completed and 305 schools handed over to MoE
- Over 11,000 communities were empowered and enabled to monitor and report on the government MSSs through scorecard
- * Milestone 8 (training of CLDD staff) issue is resolved and payment to FPs started
- * GMAF & SRBC Indicators for 2019 Achieved, and on track for 2020
- * 175 SPs for improving women livelihood are ongoing, a total of 2277 female are being trained








- * Total 328,439 people in rural areas were provided with overall 3.2 million days work under normal CCAP

Women's Participation in the Public Sphere (CARE Study, 2020)

- CDC health and education subcommittees are recognized by men as legitimate platforms for women's involvement
- The score cards that 'monitor' the Government's services provision have enabled acceptance by men
- Women view collective action as an effective strategy to increase their ability to influence public decisions

Pro-women Initiatives

The collective analysis (around economic and social conditions of poor households) has sparked debates and collective action that includes

- a change in practices that lead to indebtedness and economic decline (wedding expenses, bride price), and
- addressing obstacles that prevent women and men from realizing their potential

In Herat, a woman CDC member organizes a selfsufficient literacy group where women, girls and boys learn how to read and write.

Conceptual basis for PEACE pilot



The PEACE process has two distinct set of processes:

a. Peace making process:

The objective of the Peace making process is to stop the violence between fighting stakeholders. It considers to be political play ground considering the voice of interest groups.

b. Peace building process:

The objective of the peace building process are:

- 1. Building just, inclusive, equitable and sustainable communities; and
- 2. Building the capacities of communities to resolve their conflict Peacefully.


The Peace pilot is based on the peacebuilding process, to achieve the two objectives.

Study	Results		
KFW MCCG Report (2019)	 Citizen Satisfaction: 95% stated MCCG is very good or good, 81% very satisfied with their CDCs Poverty Reduction impacts: 99% said they used MCCG income for food, 77% for medical expenses, 23% for loan repayment 		
Asia Foundation CCAP Survey (2018)	 Attitudes towards CDCs: Top functions of CDCs are: representing community needs (60.3%); implementing infrastructure projects (40%); and coordinate with other nearby communities (22%) CDC performance: 76% satisfied with CDC performance because they represented community needs (64%), implement infra projects (38%) 83% thought CDCs are trust-worthy; 77% said that they can influence CDC decision-making CCAP Benefits: Top benefits of CCAP include: CDC activities (84%); employment benefits (73%); economic benefits (40%); infrastructure (35%); community building (28%) 		
ATR Study on CCAP and Conflict Dynamics (2019)	 Building Social Cohesion: CCAP is largely recognized as a program that reduces tensions and resolves grievances(eg 82% in Panjwayi) 73% of male respondents agree that CCAP helps decrease tensions. More work needs to be done to ensure meaningful women's participation, and increase use of High Risk Area Strategy 		
AKBAR Study (2020)	 Pro-poor emphasis: CCAP is well received by target communities Communities report social changes, highlighting new roles for women in their communities and greater awareness of poverty leading to active efforts to help alleviate challenges for the most vulnerable community members. Pro-poor emphasis of CCAP was apparent, especially through poverty targeting for employment, labor-intensive public works and grain banks.

Lack of funds for full coverage of SIG in 34 province (19 provinces current coverage)	Provide funding for the remaining un-covered provinces


