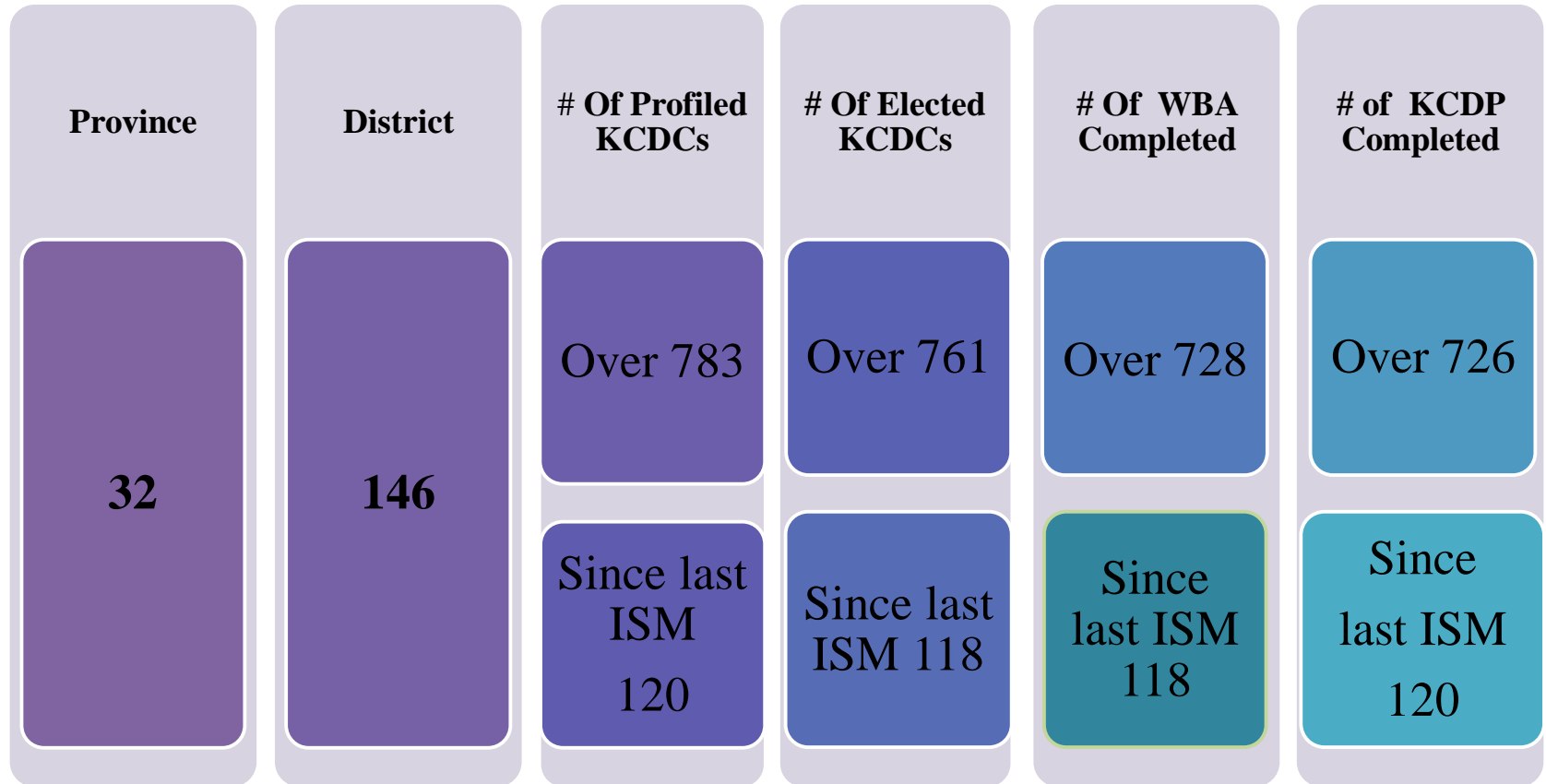

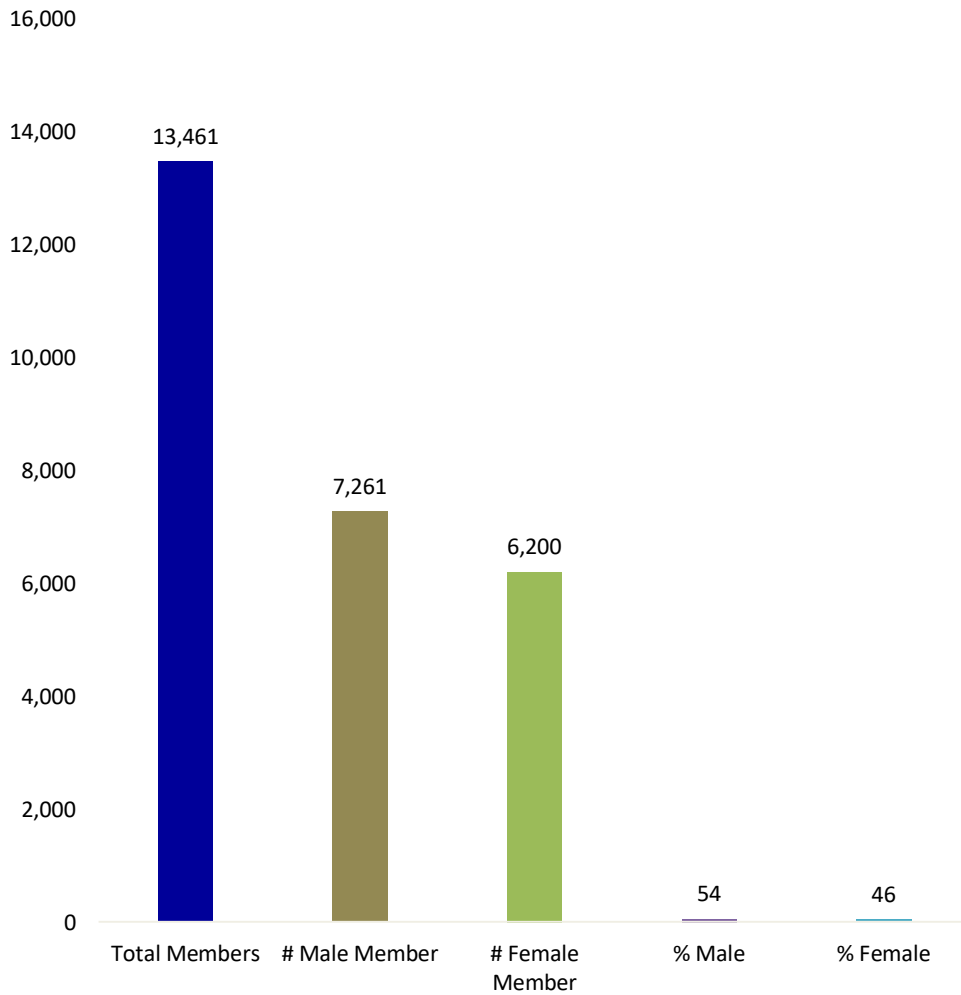

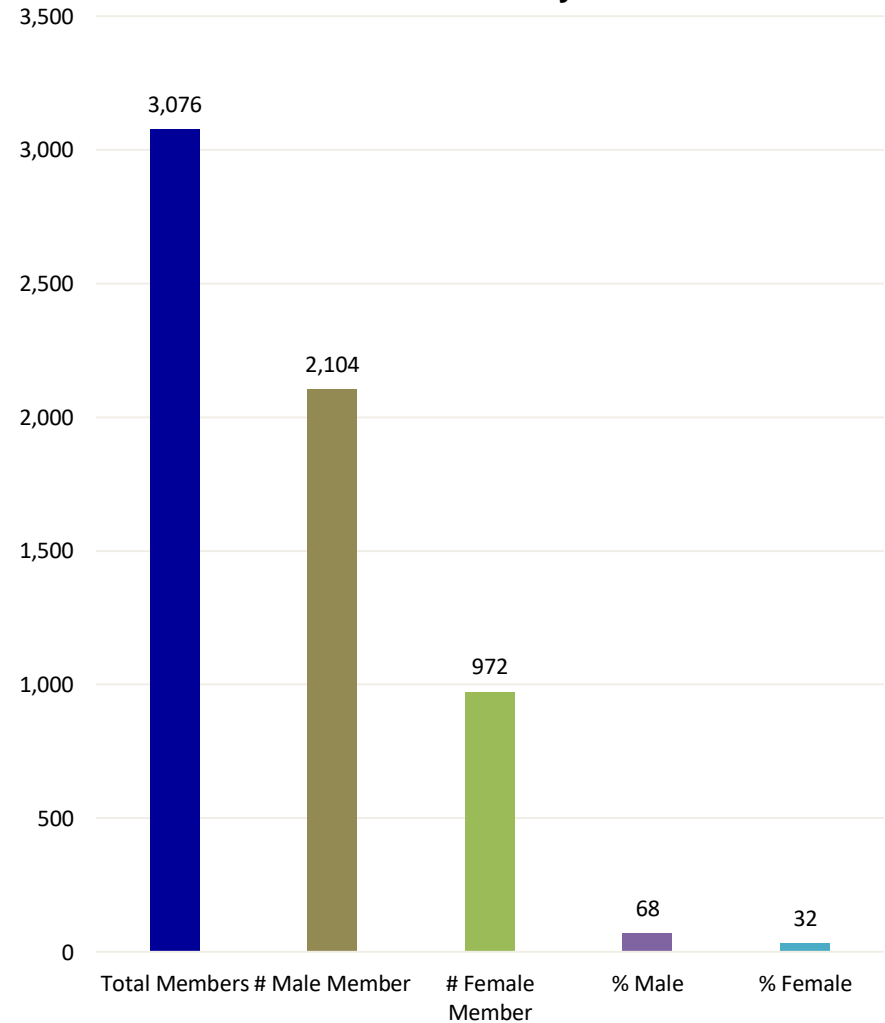


Gender Disaggregated CDC Members & Office Bearers

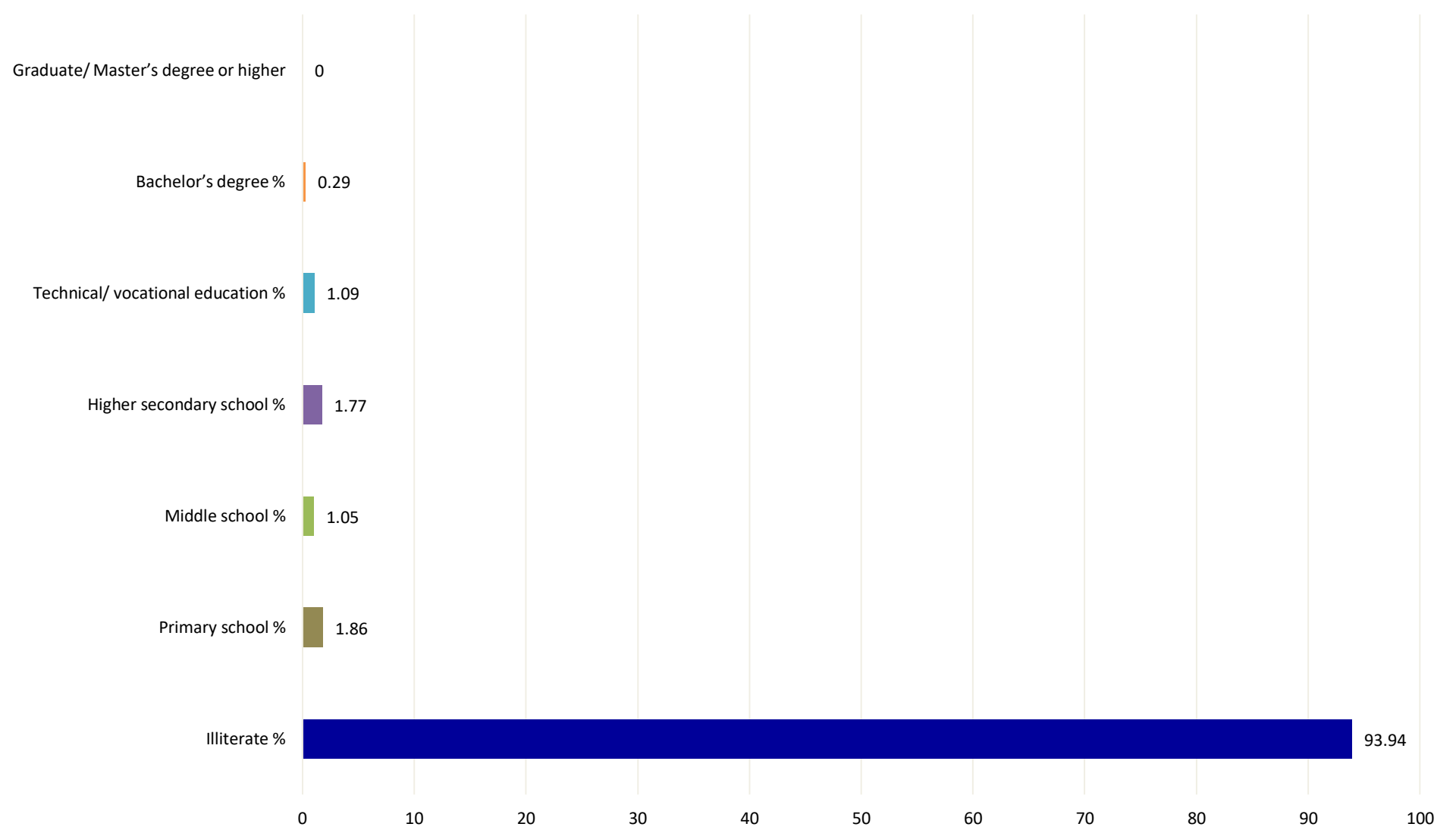
KCDC Member by Gender



KCDC Office Bearer by Gender

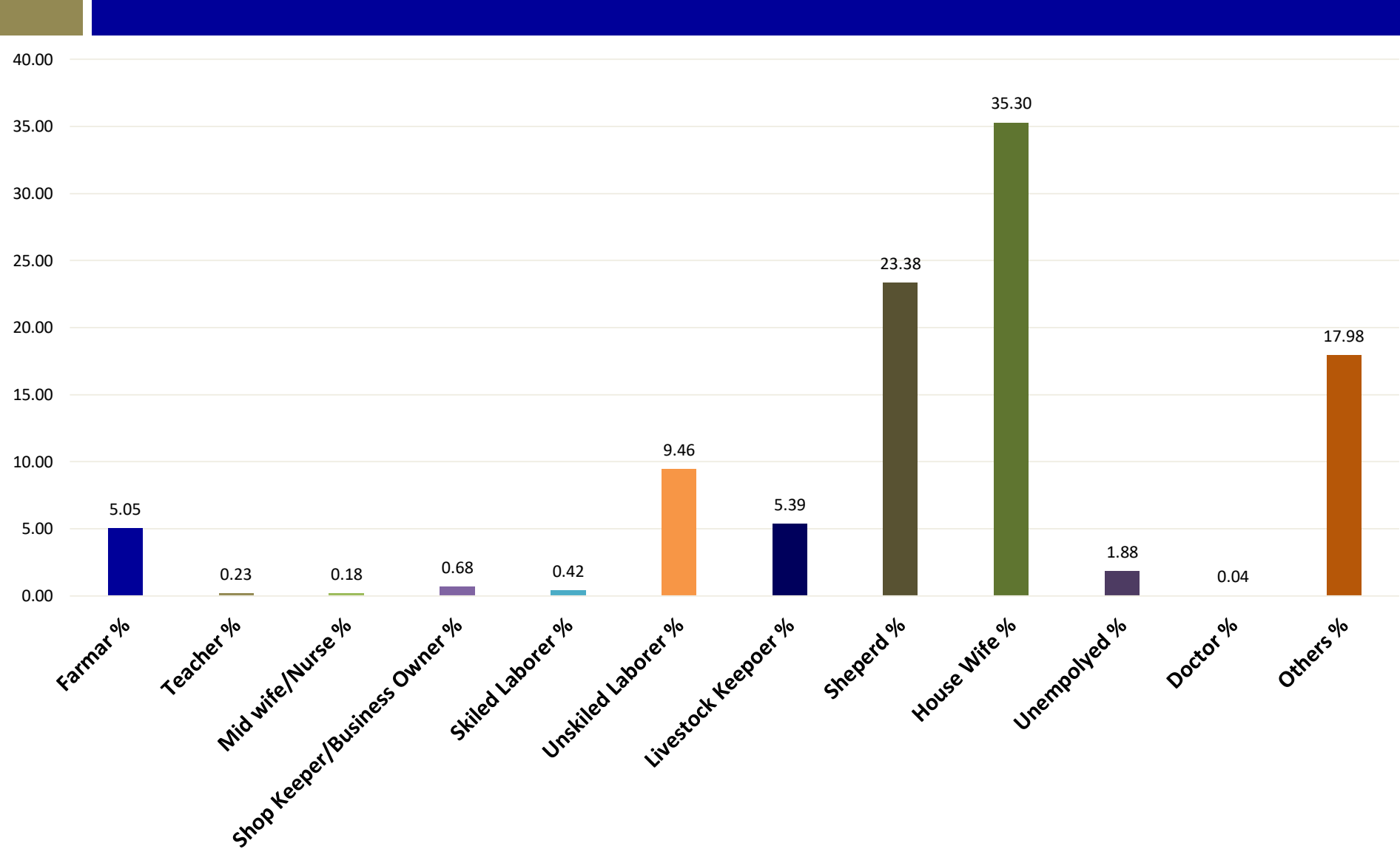


KCDC Members Educational Profile by Percentage

SIG and Kuchies Key Challenges



- FPs' insufficient attention to the Grain Bank overall process.
- Discriminative perspectives among CDCS covered under SIG and non-covered.
- One-time SIG matching grant; not enough to mitigate seasonal hunger level of the poorest population.



Key Challenges...

- Due to social and cultural taboos women's Participation in KCDCs specially as member office bears is a challenge.
- Due to high number of KCDCs and projects in some provinces, there is lack of # of Kuchi engineer for projects implementation and documentation.
- In most of the areas, public pasture lands have been seized by local landlords and powerful groups ,that has complicated the implementation of infrastructure sub-projects in such areas.



Key Challenges...

- Due to the high illiteracy rate in Kuchi communities, majority of Kuchi people still do not have Tazkiras (National Identity Cards), which is a requirement while opening bank account for the office bearers.
- Lack of land for KCDCs to implement infrastructure projects.



Recommendations

- Grain banks should be part of FPs' contractual obligations in the coming phases of the CC.
- SIG should be expanded to all CC communities.
- Matching Grant under SIG should be paid to CDCs once every year.



Recommendations...

- Kuchi Women as office bears should not be compulsory by 50 percent.
- Recruitment of 14 more engineers should be NOled by WB.
- Line Ministers are expected to support KCDCs to address the pasture problems.
- Kuchi staff should be provided with sufficient transportation facilities to pay regular visits to KCDCs and project sites.



Recommendations

- Ministry of Education should support Kuchi communities in terms of literacy courses , vocational training as well as mobile regular school classes.
- National Statistic and Information Authority should take serious measures in solving Tazkira Problem of Kuchies.
- HH Solar Projects should be NoLed and rolled out in KCDCs.
